Schact Matchless Spinning Wheel for Sale

Trisha Gow has a Schacht Matchless Spinning Wheel for sale for £500.

The wheel has a carry strap, three bobbins and an instruction book.

It is made of hard maple and black walnut and is finished with danish oil.

It can be set up for either scotch tension or double drive band.



There are three flyer whorls

- medium speed (9:1 & 11:1) for medium diameter wool, flax and some silks good for plying
- fast speed (13:1 & 15.5:1) for fine short staple wools, angora, cotton, linen, silk etc.
- slow speed (6:1 & 7.5:1) for thicker yarns good for complex yarns, liked by beginners

Llan-gors Textile

Another piece of interesting textile history was found at Llan-gors Lake in Wales in 1990. A charred lump, discovered during the excavation of a crannog, has been carefully cleaned and conserved to reveal remains of a magnificently decorated garment which is over one thousand years old. The picture below is a digital-simulation of colour on a photograph of a piece of the original textile.
