#### **Aizome Indigo Dyeing**

Carmen Wright has sent a link about a free online zoom workshop on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> April organised by Japan House in London. In the one hour workshop participants will pay a virtual visit to the dyeing workshop of Higeta Aizome in Mashiko, Japan.

The Higeta Aizome Indigo Dyeing Studio is said to have originated around 1789-1801. Today the vat storage room of the workshop has 72 indigo fermentation vats filled with leaves of Japanese indigo. Higeta Tadashi, master craftsman of aizome and ninth generation head of the workshop, will introduce the history of indigo dyeing in Mashiko and give a workshop tour. There will also be a live demonstration of spinning and weaving.
