Loomspoke - request for information

We have received the following request for information:

"I am compiling a list of unusual words that have occurred in works of fiction, and attempting to give their etymology, evolution, and history with examples. The word I am currently working on is loomspoke. This appears in an 1824 novel called *The Private Memoirs and Confessions of a Justified Sinner* by the Scottish author James Hogg.

In the scene where this word appears the central character has gone to visit a weaver in his cottage, and they get into a dispute [...] and the weaver bashes the other fellow with this loomspoke. The text reads as follows:

"...the destructive weaver seized a loomspoke, and began a-beating me most unmercifully..."

The trouble is that I am struggling to learn what a loomspoke is or was. It would appear from the context to be either part of a loom or a tool used in the operation of a loom and sufficiently robust as to be useful for use as a weapon, but beyond that I have no idea. I have consulted a number of dictionaries, including Scottish and slang dictionaries, and searched online where references to this word all point back to this same novel."

National Exhibition 2024

Information regarding the National Exhibition accompanies this newsletter. In essence:

"There are two parts to the exhibition:

- The first part is for items that are put forward for the selection process. These items may be your own ideas or may be based on this year's theme.
- The second part, the non-selected part, is open to any guild member. This year we ask that a removable book cover, on a slimline A5 or A6 notebook, is created to the theme of, 'Battles, Borders, Books'.

Items for all parts of the exhibition must include spinning, or weaving, or dyeing or a combination of these. Other textile techniques may be used as part of the item, though spinning, weaving, dyeing must be the predominant techniques."
